Cecilia Concerts launches 2017/18 season featuring Musician-In-Residence Dominic Desautels, and soprano Jane Archibald

Halifax, Nova Scotia (May 8, 2017): Cecilia Concerts, Halifax's premier presented of non-symphonic classical music, is delighted to announce it's 2017/18 concert season featuring 14 concerts.

Highlights include the season launcher on September 16 with the first of three residency concerts by clarinetist **Dominic Desautels**. Known for his singing approach to clarinet playing, Desautels is the winner of several competitions and awards in Canada, including Radio-Canada's *Auditions Jeunes Artistes*, and the concerto competitions of the Université de Montréal and Orchestre de la Francophonie. "Dominic has truly embraced the role of Musician-In-Residence suggesting highly creative programming and recommending unique musical collaborations," says Cecilia Concerts' Chairperson Jules Chamberlain. "We're delighted to be working with this highly sought-after artist."

Belgian ensemble **Psallentes** is known around the world for their performance of plainchant and has released more than 25 recordings. Presented on October 29 at St. Mary's Basilica on Spring Garden Road, the concert is presented in partnership with The Fountain School of Performing Arts and the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia, which is currently exhibiting "Centuries of Silence: The Discovery of the Salzinnes Antiphonal", an exhibition featuring the ancient manuscript containing the music the vocalists of **Psallentes** will perform during this special presentation. Also from Belgium, magical collective **Ô-Celli**, an ensemble featuring eight cellists, will perform October 29 and will take their Halifax audience on a tour through a wide exploration of musical territory ranging from Tchaikovsky to Strauss, and from Piazzolla to Nino Rota.

The winner of multiple Juno awards and the recipient of an Order of Canada, renowned pianist Jane Coop will perform masterpieces by Beethoven and Rachmaninoff in her November 12 piano recital "Giants of the Piano". Canadian fusion group Ladom Ensemble will perform on March 10, 2018. The spread of the group reaches far across the world as their all-original repertoire incorporates inspirations from Argentinian jazz/classical tango, Serbian folk dance, and Persian classical dulcimer. Reflecting a beautiful new world with a Western classical toolset, critics call them "elegant and contemplative," and "rocking and fiery".

"This season's launch is our most ambitious ever, acknowledging the wealth of local, national and international talent we will be presenting in 2017/18," says Cecilia Concerts' Executive Director D'Arcy Poultney. Other season highlights include: *Postcards From France* (Cameron Crozman, cello; Hugo Lee, oboe; Philip Chiu, piano); *O Mistress Moon* (Jennifer King, piano); *Heemin Choi Recital* (Heemin Choi, violin); *Faune & Naïades* (Ariane Brisson, flute; Olivier

Hébert-Bouchard, piano); **Red Piano** (Jeanne Amièle, piano; Simon Larivière, piano); and a production of Mozart & da Ponte's opera **Don Giovanni**.

The season finishes with a special presentation recital by celebrated soprano **Jane Archibald**. She has generated excitement across Europe and North America, debuting many coloratura roles, which she continues to perform. Renowned for her extraordinary technical abilities, Jane won the JUNO Award for Classical Album of the Year for her debut solo album. She will be joined by esteemed pianist Liz Upchurch.

With the exception of Psallentes, all concerts will take place at the Maritime Conservatory of Performing Arts, 6199 Chebucto Road in Halifax. Tickets and ticket passes for Cecilia Concerts 2017/18 Season are now available online at ceciliaconcerts.ca and by phone at 902 423 0143.
