Belgian medieval chant ensemble Psallentes to perform works from illuminated manuscript in Halifax

Halifax, Nova Scotia (September 12, 2017): Cecilia Concerts in partnership with the Fountain School of the Performing Arts at Dalhousie University, Saint Mary's University, and the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia presents Belgian-based medieval vocal ensemble Psallentes on stage in Halifax, Saturday, September 23, 8:00pm at St. Mary's Basilica, 5221 Spring Garden Road.

Psallentes is known internationally for their performance of plainchant. The ensemble, which has released more than 25 recordings, focuses on late Medieval and Renaissance plainsong and related polyphony. From careful investigation and extensive use of original manuscripts, Psallentes gather evidence on how this music was performed. For this special Halifax concert, the chant ensemble performs works from the Salzinnes Antiphonal (1554-1555), which is an illuminated choir book originating from the Cistercian Abbey of Salzinnes on the outskirts of Namur (present-day Belgium). It made its way to Halifax in the 19th century and was rediscovered in 1998. After years of research, analysis, and conservation treatment the brilliant book is celebrating its first public display at the Art Gallery of Nova Scotia. The exhibition offers a once-in-a-lifetime opportunity to see a unique 16th-century artifact that transitioned from use in its European setting to a new life across the Atlantic.
