Cecilia Concerts launches 2017/18 classical music season with concert featuring six-million-dollar, three-hundred-year-old Stradivarius cello on stage in Halifax

Halifax, Nova Scotia (September 5, 2017): An all-star trio of young Canadian musicians including clarinettist Dominic Desautels, who is Cecilia Concerts' 2017/18 Musician-In-Residence, cellist Stéphane Tétreault and pianist Jean-Philippe Sylvestre perform Beethoven and Brahms clarinet trios on Saturday, September 16 at 7:00pm at the Lilian Piercey Concert Hall in the Maritime Conservatory of Performing Arts (6199 Chebucto Road) in Halifax.

The celebrated Stéphane Tétreault will play a 1707 Stradivarius cello worth more than six-million-dollars. The instrument had previously belonged to the Countess of Stainlein, Italian composer Niccolo Paganini in the mid-1800s and then to the famous Parisian luthier Jean-Baptiste Vuillaume. The instrument is currently on indefinite loan by Mrs. Jacqueline Desmarais.

In addition to numerous awards and honours, Stéphane was selected as laureate of the 2015-2016 Classe d'Excellence de violoncelle Gautier Capuçon from the Fondation Louis Vuitton, and received the 2015 Women's Musical Club of Toronto Career Development Award. He was the very first recipient of the \$50,000 Fernand-Lindsay Career Award as well as the Choquette-Symcox Award laureate in 2013.

Dominic Desautels has been the principal clarinettist at Symphony Nova Scotia since 2012. He has quickly earned acclaim and recognition since his debut as soloist at age 21 with the Toronto Symphony Orchestra. Known for his singing approach to clarinet playing, Dominic is the winner of several competitions and awards in Canada, including Radio-Canada's *Auditions Jeunes Artistes*, and the concerto competitions of the Université de Montréal and Orchestre de la Francophonie. Dominic Desautels has recently been named a Backun Artist and plays MoBa clarinets made with cocobolo wood, crafted in Canada.

Jean-Philippe Sylvestre won the Virginia Parker prize, the highest distinction attributed by the Canadian Council for the Arts to any musician. Laureate of the first prize of the Montreal Symphonic Orchestra Competition, he also won the CBC National Radio Competition for Young Performers and the International Radio Competition for Young Musicians 'Concertino Praga'. He plays regularly in Canada, in the United States, in South America, and in Europe. Not only is he a talented international classical pianist, but he is also an excellent jazz piano player.
